### Part I: Topic and Structure

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- Headings, graphics, charts, and multimedia elements are included where appropriate.
- The conclusion follows logically from the information presented. It supports the topic clearly and may provide insight into the importance of the topic.

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- Extended definitions, concrete details, quotations, and examples add further support to the topic.
- The supporting details are appropriate for the audience's knowledge about the topic.

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- Transitions clarify the relationships between complex ideas and concepts that support the topic.

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### Part IV: Effective Language and Tone

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- The writing maintains a formal style and an objective tone.
- The text follows standard norms and conventions, including standard English grammar, usage, and mechanics.
