- combine several brainstorming suggestions to develop a solution to a problem
- develop a consensus of opinion based on everyone's ideas

In what other situations might you use synthesis and integration?

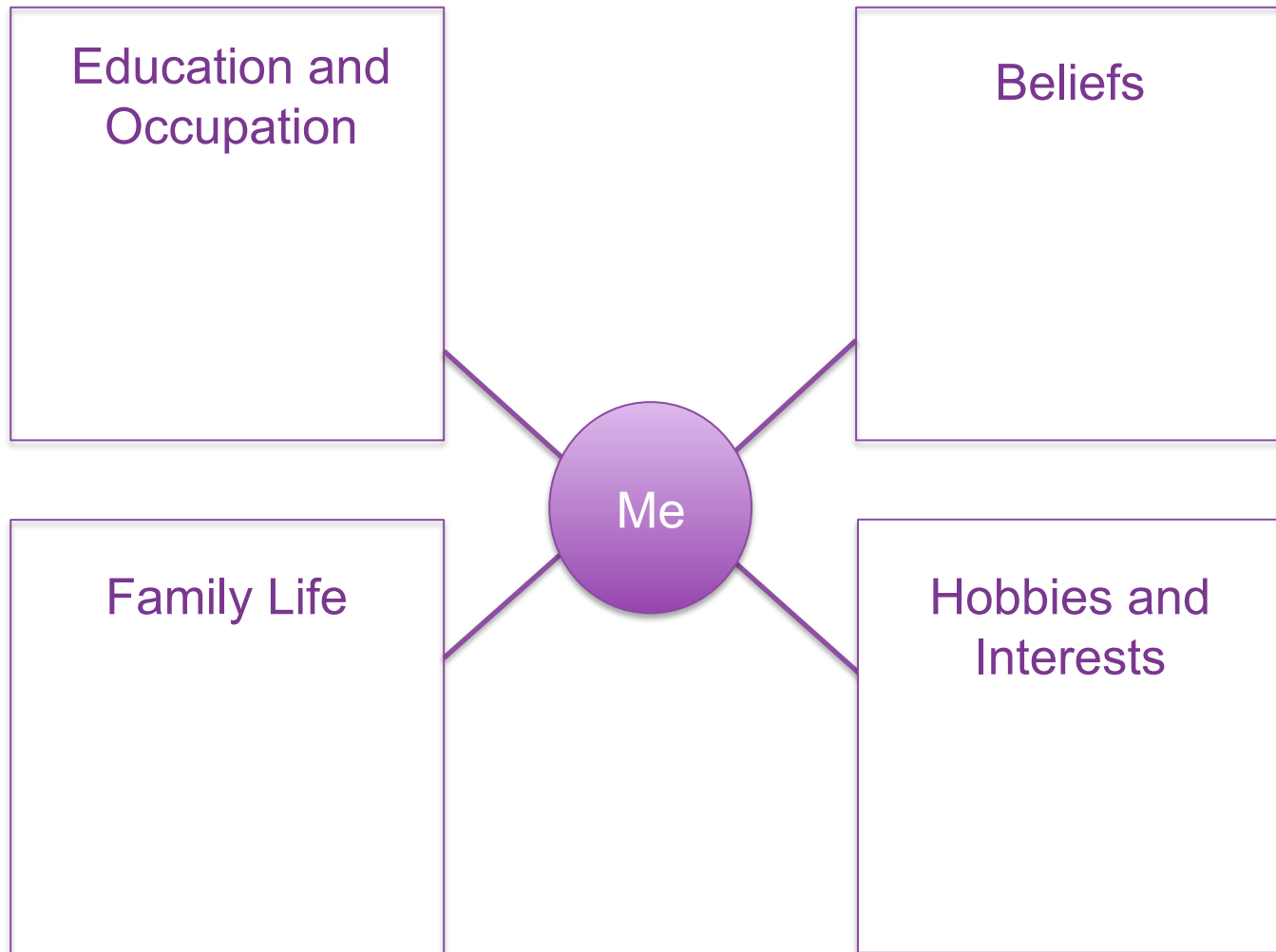
